Answers fit into the grid in two ways: Rows and Bands.

Each Row consists of two answers entered back-to-back; their dividing points are for you to determine, except for Row 5, which consists of two four-letter entries separated by the central black square.

Band answers are entered consecutively in their respective bands, starting in the lettered square, traveling in a clockwise pattern and ending at the square underneath the lettered square.

Each square will be used twice, once in a Row answer and once in a Band answer.
